The Holy Trinity is famously difficult to understand. The problem is not that the Trinity is complicated: rather, it's the simplicity of God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, which is so hard to grasp. In the liturgy we celebrate the closeness to us of God whom we know and address as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The closeness of the Trinity is seen in the number of times Father, Son and Spirit are invoked in our liturgy.



A MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP NOLAN

10th June 2025

Dear Father Joe.

Merger of St Bernard's and St Robert's

Thank you for informing me of the consultations that took place in the parishes about the proposed merger of the two parishes. I have also heard from the Dean and from the Council of Priests.

I am aware of the feelings of the parishioners of St Bernard's that in the past they have felt like second class citizens in relation to St Robert's. St Bernard's parishioners, though, do appreciate all that you have done in recent years to see that they are treated fairly. Parishioners also have a fear that the church will be closed. No one can give any guarantee as to how long the church will remain open. The long-term future is uncertain. As you know that was the opinion of the deanery consultations and parishioners should face that reality.

Parishioners of both parishes need to work together in harmony and put past animosities behind them. It is good that there is already a joint Parish Pastoral Council. A merger will bring other agencies of the parishes together, such as finance and safeguarding.

Next week I intend to issue a decree merging the two parishes, by which St Bernard's will be absorbed into St Robert's, with one parish of St Robert's remaining with the two churches, St Bernard's and St Robert's, to take effect at the start of September.
