

Gn 14: 18-20 Ps 110 (109) 1 Co 11: 23-26 Lk 9: 11-17

The Feeding of the Five Thousand is the only miracle found in all four Gospels. There are minor variations in the accounts. In Year C we read Luke's version. Here, we are told that Jesus gave instructions for the people to be seated in parties of about fifty. Typically, Luke likes order! This arrangement however reminds us that the miracle is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist which we celebrate today, hopefully also in an ordered fashion!

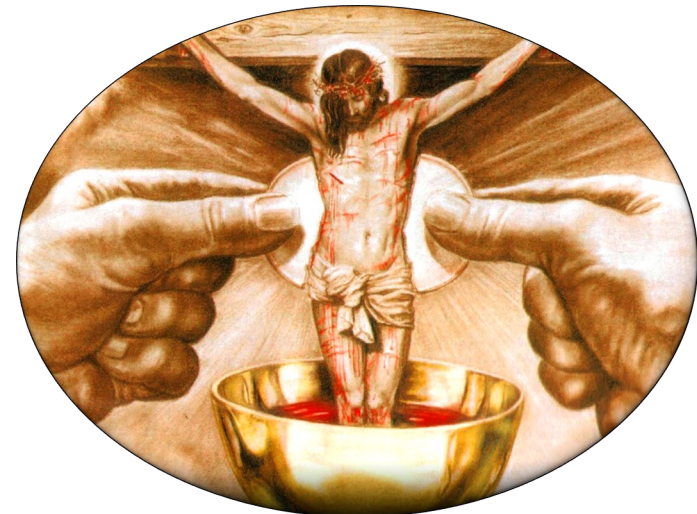
